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ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

SUMMARY

Each year, the Kings/Tulare Homeless Alliance (Alliance) conducts a Point in Time (PIT) count of the number of people experiencing sheltered and unsheltered homelessness within Kings and Tulare Counties. Information and data gathered through the PIT count are used by the Alliance and partner agencies to better understand the issues associated with homelessness, including causes, service gaps, unmet housing needs, and homeless trends.

METHODOLOGY

Kings and Tulare Counties conducted their 2023 Point in Time (PIT) count on the night of January 22-23, 2023. Volunteers from local jurisdictions, law enforcement, the faith-based community, nonprofit partners, and community stakeholders came together to conduct short surveys with people who meet the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) definition of homeless. Volunteers canvassed locations where people experiencing homelessness tend to congregate including encampments, libraries, food distribution sites, etc. The PIT Report provides a snapshot of the people experiencing homelessness in Kings and Tulare Counties.

Several factors can influence the PIT count including weather, number of volunteers, and count methodology.

The weather on the week of the count had temperatures in the low-40s with little precipitation. This cool, dry weather may have allowed unhoused individuals to leave their encampments to run errands, making them more challenging to count.

107 volunteers completed surveys with people experiencing homeless in the 2023 PIT count. This is a 20% increase from the number of individuals who volunteered for the 2022 PIT count (79 volunteers). The increased number of volunteers may have lead to the increase in the total PIT number.

Similar to the 2022 count, the 2023 PIT count was not completed in collaboration with large Project Homeless Connect events. Some communities (Hanford, Porterville, and Visalia) did utilize regularly scheduled drop-in programs to facilitate the count.

The Kings Tulare Homeless Alliance (Alliance) led multiple meetings and training to plan the PIT count beginning in November of 2022. The Cities of Porterville, Tulare, and Visalia, as well as Kings County, each had their own PIT subcommittee led by two or three people knowledgeable about homelessness in the region. Decisions on canvassing/mapping, incentives, and overall approach were made by each subcommittee and supported by the Alliance.

OVERVIEW OF RESULTS

The 2023 PIT count saw an increase of 235 individuals (1,235 people in 2022 vs. 1,470 people in 2023) or a 16% increase in the number of people experiencing sheltered and unsheltered homelessness in Kings and Tulare Counties. KTHA feels that the increase in PIT numbers is the result of the following circumstances:

- The end of COVID-19 era supports and projects including Project Room Key and the eviction moratorium;
- The cost of living increases resulting from higher rents, utility costs, food costs, etc.;
- The lack of affordable housing in Kings and Tulare Counties;
- The City of Tulare's Encampment Resolution Funding Project has centralized people, making them easier to count; and
- The increase in the number of volunteers participating in street canvassing for the PIT.

This is a shocking increase in the number of people experiencing sheltered and unsheltered homelessness across our region but is in no way an indication of a lack of hard work done by jurisdictions, non-profits, and community leaders to address this growing problem.

OVERVIEW OF RESULTS (CONTINUED)

The number of people experiencing chronic homelessness increased by 112 individuals (327 people in 2022 vs. 439 in 2023), or a 25.51% increase. This could be a long-term result of people who entered homelessness due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2022 count saw an increase in people experiencing homelessness for the first time; if those individuals remained homeless, they might now be classified as chronic.

There were 37 fewer people accessing emergency shelter beds in 2023 (245 individuals) than in 2022 (282 individuals), which is a 15% decrease. We believe this is because the number of available beds decreased from 442 beds in 2022 to 387 beds in 2023 as a result of Project Roomkey (PRK) shelters closing and/or transitioning to permanent supportive housing units.

The City of Hanford saw a more significant increase in PIT numbers (260 individuals counted in 2022 vs. 383 in 2023). The City of Visalia saw a marked decrease of 35 people (469 individuals in 2022 vs. 434 in 2023). Both the Cities of Porterville and Tulare saw smaller increases in their PIT counts (Porterville: 212 in 2022 vs. 299 in 2023; Tulare: 212 in 2022 vs. 284 in 2023).

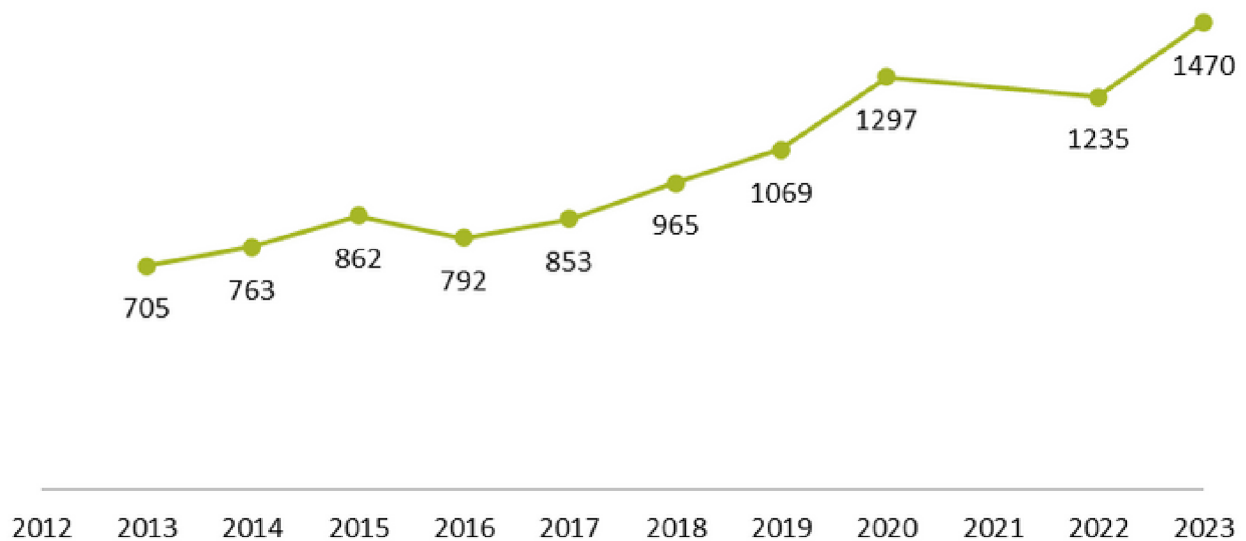
The Alliance feels that all efforts were made to uniformly support each community to conduct the PIT count and each was completed as accurately as possible.
